The symposium will provide a platform for researchers and policy makers to discuss new research findings and to identify areas where further academic and policy-oriented work is needed. Papers are invited on the following – non-exhaustive – list of topics:

- International trade, interdependence and conflict
- Global value chain disruptions
- International finance, capital flows, and geopolitics
- The war on Ukraine and trade diversion
- The economic effects, design, and circumvention of trade and financial sanctions
- The effects of sanctions on regime stability and domestic support
- The trade impact of war at the national and international level
- The political economy of sanctions in implementing countries
- Energy security, transport networks and control of supply routes

The symposium will feature a Keynote Address by Prof. **Shang-Jin Wei** (Columbia University).

Accommodation expenses will be covered for speakers and discussants. Travel expenses will be reimbursed in accordance with CEPR’s expense [guidelines](#).
